(KLAY munt) *n.*

a person making a claim

"A CLAIMANT CLAIMING ANTS"


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- ❑ The **CLAIMANT** of the Virginia City silver mine was Scott "Wormy" McClennahan, a miner.
 - ❑ The judge awarded all six of the **CLAIMANTS** an equal share of the insurance money.
 - ❑ Rosalie not only wanted the house in her divorce from Robert, but she was also the **CLAIMANT** of his art collection.

CLOISTER

(KLOY stur) *n./v.*

a tranquil, secluded place

Link: **OYSTER**



*“An **OYSTER** in his **CLOISTER**”*

- Mary regarded her sewing room as a **CLOISTER** where she could withdraw from her hectic life as a mother of six and enjoy moments of privacy. (*n.*)
 - (To **CLOISTER** someone is to place them in a place of seclusion, although they may or may not be in the company of others.) Jim **CLOISTERED** himself in his hotel room for the entire week of his vacation. (*v.*)

COMMODIOUS

(kuh MOH dee us) *adj.*
spacious, roomy, capacious

Link: **COMMUNE**



“A COMMODIOUS COMMUNE”

- ❑ The rooms in the castle were so **COMMODIOUS** that they were as large as the average home.
 - ❑ The **COMMODIOUS** limousine accommodated the entire family and our luggage.
 - ❑ In Hong Kong, the government has built several million apartments for the working class in recent decades. Compared to western standards, they are not very **COMMODIOUS**, only about half the size of a small, two-bedroom apartment in the United States.

COMPRISE

(kum PRIZE) v.

to consist of; to include, to contain, to be made up of

Link: **SURPRISE**



*"It was not a pleasant **SURPRISE** when the pirates discovered their treasure was **COMPRISED** only of party favors."*

- ❑ If we had one more kitten in the house, the litter would **COMPRISE** thirteen.
 - ❑ A basketball team **COMPRISES** five players and any number of substitutes the coach wants to allow on the team.
 - ❑ The first aid kit **COMPRISED** of a bottle of aspirin, two gauze pads, and a pair of scissors.

CONGENIAL

(kun JEEN ee ul) *adj.*

pleasant to be around; social, agreeable

Link: **JEANS**



*“Folks in **JEANS** are very **CONGENIAL**.”*

- ❑ The **CONGENIAL** Dr. Armstrong always had a smile and a kind word for his patients, and candies for the children.
 - ❑ David’s **CONGENIAL** personality made it easy for him to make friends.
 - ❑ The atmosphere at the property appraiser’s office is **CONGENIAL**. Everyone enjoys their job, and visitors are welcome at any time.

CONNOISSEUR

(kahn uh SUR) *n.*

an expert, particularly in matters of art and taste

Link: **KING OF SEWER**




*“The **KING OF the SEWER** is a **CONNOISSEUR** of garbage.”*

 - ❑ Art dealer, Jorge Guizar, is a **CONNOISSEUR** of Mexican art of the 19th century.
 - ❑ When it came to coins, Jerry proclaimed he was a **CONNOISSEUR**, because he had collected them all his life.
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CONSENSUS

(kun SEN sus) *n.*
general agreement

Link: **SENDS US**



*“We are in **CONSENSUS**, this guy **SENDS US**.”*


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- ❑ The family **CONSENSUS** was to celebrate Christmas at Aunt Karen’s house this year.
 - ❑ The **CONSENSUS** of the faculty was that no more chili dogs were to be served at the school lunch.
 - ❑ A **CONSENSUS** is more than a majority, it means most everyone agrees.
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COTERIE

(KOH tuh ree) *n.*

a circle of close associates or friends

Link: **COAT FOR THREE**



*“The maestro and his **COTERIE**
in a **COAT FOR THREE**”*

- Today’s tennis stars rarely travel alone, but with a **COTERIE** of managers and coaches.
 - Rock stars have a **COTERIE** of fans who follow them around like leeches.
 - His films are admired by a small **COTERIE** of critics.

COUNTENANCE

(KOWN tuh nunz) *n.*

a person's face, especially the expression

Link: **COUNT THE NUTS**



*“By their facial **COUNTENANCE** alone
it was easy to **COUNT THE NUTS.**”*

- ❑ The submarine commander's **COUNTENANCE** belied his true feelings of anxiety and fear.
 - ❑ John Barrymore had a magnificent series of **COUNTENANCES**, one for every role he played.
 - ❑ (To **COUNTENANCE** something is to tolerate or approve of it.) The coach **COUNTENANCED** the players' horse play, even though he didn't approve of it.

COUP

(koo) *n.*

the violent overthrow of a government by a small group; a victorious accomplishment

Link: **CREW**



*“In a midnight **COUP**, the mutinous **CREW** of ‘The Bounty’ threw Captain Bligh off his ship.”*

- ❑ In this century alone there have been almost one hundred military **COUPS** in Latin America.
 - ❑ It was a real **COUP** for James when his team-mates elected him captain of the basketball team.
 - ❑ The violent **COUP** ended when the radical political leaders were escorted out of the capitol in shackles.
